As residents experienced, the wind event on Wednesday, July 24th, drove aggressive fire behaviour and significant fire activity both up and downslope. This prompted evacuation alerts and orders to be implemented in multiple locations in the area.

This increase in activity also resulted in heavy smoke in the valleys and impacts to visibility. Though aircraft are often able to work at lower elevations, they have been unable to access higher elevations in the valleys due to increased concentrations of smoke.

Since the wind event, officers have been unable to fly the whole fire to get an accurate picture of new growth and provide a track of the new perimeter. A high-level scan happened the morning of July 26th and it returned limited results because of the level of interference (ie: smoke and cloud cover).

In order to provide transparent information, officers are using less precise methods to estimate fire growth. It is believed that up to seven fires, of various sizes, on the east side of the Kootenay and Duncan Lakes have merged, including Argenta Creek (N71058).

As a result, we are anticipating the updated fire sizes in this cluster to see considerable growth when it is updated tomorrow (July 27th).

This estimate will remain listed until smoke clears, an accurate track can be taken, and the size may change again. The merged fires will be removed from the dashboard July 27th and will be called Argenta Creek (N71058) moving forward and will be listed as a Wildfire of Note on the wildfire map.

SEFC Information Section

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The cold front passage peaked July 24th. This instability resulted in strong south winds that continued to drive aggressive fire behaviour. Temperatures sitting at or below seasonal values and increased relative humidity is helping suppression efforts, though a return to warm and dry conditions is expected.

Operations:

Argenta Creek (N71058)

- Contingency guards continue to be established from Argenta Creek to Carter Creek are nearing completion
- Crews are following recently established guard with hoselay and water delivery systems to reinforce
- Structure protection has been completed
- Helicopters will support ground crews by bucketing to cool the fires edge at lower elevations as visibility allows

Lower Meadow Mountain (N71101)

The guard is continuing to hold

Closure:

As a proactive measure, BC Parks has closed the Earl Grey Pass trailhead due to the proximity of the N71089 and N71088 wildfires.
