Our concern is where is the building located; due to the view from our home across the street?
We want no obstructions, how tall is the proposed building?
Due to our terrible winters and road conditions (November - April) it is not practical to have said building close to the road due to how much snow we get, up to 4 feet, and with the snow plow the snow banks reach up to 12 feet high on both sides of Whitelock Rd. By having said building too close to the road, the snow plow and grader will end up narrowing the road making for a single lane only street. Mr. Wong should familiarize himself with the sheer amount of snow that we get up here each winter; and then he may want to reconsider putting his building so close to the side of the road, as it could be damaged or destroyed by the snow plow and grader going past.
We also have a serious amount of dust in the spring/summer from the gravel road, if his electrical building is full of high tech equipment, dust may not be compatible.
